

Washington State Patrol Memorial Foundation  
Fiscal Year Update  
10/1/12 thru 9/30/13

Since 1982, the Washington State Patrol Memorial Foundation (WSPMF) has provided \$1,613,663 in financial assistance to Washington State Patrol employees and their families. This year marks the 22<sup>nd</sup> year of the scholarship program. The WSPMF provided 10 new scholarships and 16 renewable scholarships in the last fiscal year, totaling \$26,000 to families of the Washington State Patrol.

In addition to scholarships, the WSPMF provided \$60,933 in assistance to WSP families in need this year. While much of the assistance provided by the WSPMF is confidential in nature, the WSPMF is proud to disclose its involvement in the following activities:

- The WSPMF provided financial assistance to build the Memorial for Trooper Tony Radulescu which is located at the Bremerton District Office. On February 22, 2013, a dedication ceremony of the memorial to honor and remember Trooper Tony Radulescu was held at the Bremerton District Office.
- The WSPMF Board of Directors participated in the Ben & Jerry's Ice Cream event on April 9, 2013, and raised \$3,183.47 for the WSPMF.
- The WSPMF Dinner, held in Bremerton on April 27, 2013, raised \$26,935.84 for our Fallen Officers' Spouse and Children College Fund. Family members of Troopers Tony Radulescu, James Saunders, Steven Frink, Cliff Hansell, James Gain, and Frank Noble and Officer Joseph Modlin attended the Memorial Dinner as our guests. Core Values award recipients, Trooper Marcus Sanchez and Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Officer Al Alderson, read the names of our fallen officers and were our guests for the evening.
- The WSPMF sent members of the Radulescu family and Trooper Radulescu's Pallbearers (detachment) to the National Law Enforcement Week in Washington D.C. the week of May 12, 2013. Trooper Tony Radulescu's name was formally dedicated at the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington D.C. during the Annual Candlelight Vigil on May 13, 2013. Approximately 20,000 people attend this event. A Memorial ceremony was held on May 15, 2013, where President Barack Obama spoke and met with family members.

The WSPMF currently has 1,145 contributing members (953 active and 192 retired employees). To be a voting member of the WSPMF, you must contribute \$5 per month or \$2.50 a pay period. This minimal deduction goes a long way toward helping WSP families in times of need.
